I. Amman-Berlin Declaration

The Declaration sets out two specific targets, the second of which being:





*We will strive to ensure that **at least 15 percent** of international development programs being implemented **at the country level** pursue disability inclusion as an objective (“**15 percent for the 15 percent**”).*

We will strive to achieve this target by 2028, the year in which the fourth and next *Global Disability Summit* is to be held.

To achieve this target, the donor countries that have endorsed the Declaration commit to the following:

- reporting on the number of programs on disability inclusion; and
- increasing their efforts to target disability inclusion in their portfolio

II. Key Statistics*

	The European Commission implemented a total of 1640 ODA activities globally.
	The European Commission implemented ODA activities in 40 recipient countries that have endorsed the declaration.
	There is available data for 100% of ODA activities funded by The European Commission globally.
	Disability inclusion is a target of 38,5% of ODA activities funded by The European Commission globally.
