

## Implementation of the Amman-Berlin Declaration - Donor Profile (February 2026) -



### I. Amman-Berlin Declaration

The Declaration sets out two specific targets, the second of which being:





*We will strive to ensure that **at least 15 percent** of international development programs being implemented **at the country level** pursue disability inclusion as an objective (“**15 percent for the 15 percent**”).*

We will strive to achieve this target by 2028, the year in which the fourth and next *Global Disability Summit* is to be held.

To achieve this target, the donor countries that have endorsed the Declaration commit to the following:

- reporting on the number of programs on disability inclusion; and
- increasing their efforts to target disability inclusion in their portfolio

### II. Key Statistics\*

	Spain implemented a total of <b>5206 ODA activities</b> globally.
	Spain implemented ODA activities in <b>46 recipient countries</b> that have endorsed the declaration.
	There is <b>available data for 87,7%</b> of ODA activities funded by Spain globally.
	Disability inclusion is a target of <b>2,0%</b> of ODA activities funded by Spain globally.
